- Approved the Audited Financial Results (standalone and consolidated) for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2021. Please find enclosed a copy of the same alongwith the Auditors' Report thereon which gives an unmodified opinion.
- 2. Recommended a dividend of Rs. 8/- per Equity Share of Rs. 2/- each (400%) for the Financial Year ended 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2021.

The Board of Directors, on the recommendation of the Nomination of Remuneration Committee, has approved the appointment of Mr. Willem Rudolf Basson as Director (Non-Executive Non-Independent Director), with effect from the 64<sup>th</sup> AGM, subject to approval of the Members.

Mr. Basson is not related to any Director of the Company. We affirm that Mr. Basson is not debarred from holding the office of Director by virtue of any order of the Securities and Exchange Board of India or any other such authority.

### Opinion

#### Notes :

1 On 1 March 2021, the Company acquired 99.22% equity share capital of C&S Electric Limited from its promoters for a preliminary sale share consideration of Rs. 21,588 million, payable in cash, on cash free/debt free basis on terms and conditions that are mutually agreed between the parties to the transaction. Considering post Closing amendments to the Share Purchase Agreement, the investment value is Rs. 21,570 million as on 30 September 2021.

2 During the previous year, the Company's operations and financial results were adversely impacted by the lockdown imposed to contain the spread of Coronavirus (COVID-19) since last week of March 2020. The operations gradually resumed with requisite precautions during the quarter ended 30 June 2020 with limited availability of workforce and disrupted supply chain. Consequently, the results for year ended 30 September 2020 were affected. Further, during the current year, the operations for the quarter ended 30 June 2021 and year ended 30 September 2021 were impacted due to the second wave of COVID-19. The expenses incurred during shutdown and partial shutdown in respect of continuing operations were as under:

3 On 1 January 2021, the Company divested its Mechanical Drives (MD) business as a going concern on a slump sale basis to Flender Drives Private Limited for a final consideration of Rs. 3,759 million (after adjusting the consideration of Rs 4,400 million for changes in net current assets and capital expenditure as per the terms and conditions agreed between the parties). The gain on the sale transaction is Rs. 487 million for the year ended 30 September 2021. For the fourth quarter of Financial Year 2021, ended September 30, 2021, Siemens Limited registered a Standalone Revenue of Rs. 3,941 crore, a 15.2% increase over the corresponding quarter of the previous year, driven largely by the Digital Industries, Energy and Smart Infrastructure businesses. The Company's Order Backlog stands at an all-time high of Rs. 13,520 crore.

For the Financial Year 2021, Siemens Limited reported an increase of 32.4% in New Orders, 33.1% in Revenue and 40.3% in Profit after Tax from continuing operations over the previous Financial year.
