Siemens Canada donates \$10,000 to Coast To Coast Against Cancer Foundation in recognition of employee fundraising

Siemens Canada is donating \$10,000 to Coast To Coast Against Cancer Foundation in recognition of Oakville employee Steve Mainguy, winner of the organization's Greatest Community Supporter Contest.

The contest aims to recognize employees who are leaders in their community through volunteering and fundraising activities. Mainguy fundraised more than \$13,000 for the organization by cycling 1,349 kms over eight days at two annual cycling events. His team raised more than \$385,000 for the cause.
