Choose Healthy Life

Network of Black churches expanding from five key cities—Atlanta, Detroit, Newark, New York, & Washington, DC—as the leading national faith-based initiative addressing the impacts of COVID-19 and other health disparities on Black Americans. Implemented a national model to increase access to health screenings, vaccinations, and resources through health navigators, supported by the Siemens Foundation.

- 2021: COVID-19 Vaccine Outreach (\$330k)
- 2022: Community Health Navigators Curriculum and Training Development (\$500k)
- 2023: Community Health Navigators Training Implementation (Planned: \$500K)

Washington Association for Community Health

Expands access to high-quality health care by providing training expansion technical assistance to health centers across the U.S. They are increasing innovative healthcare apprenticeships for medical assistants and dental assistants as part of their In-REACH training program to deliver better care through a more diverse and inclusive health workforce while increasing economic opportunity for their communities and community residents.

- 2022 2024: In-REACH Apprenticeship Program expansion to eight states while developing and testing training programs for new healthcare careers in WA before further expansion (\$2.58M)
- By 2025, In-REACH projects 1,500 new apprentices annually across existing and new occupations, and across new states. Within three years, the number of apprentices trained through consulting with states is expected to grow by more than 1,000 annually.

COVID-19 Response and Outreach

Since 2020, the Siemens Foundation has worked to advance health equity in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, directly impacting 21 cities across the country: Atlanta, Cleveland, Houston, Memphis, Minneapolis, St. Paul, Washington, D.C., Seattle, New York, Huntsville, Chicago, Malvern, Sacramento, Los Angeles, Denver, Winter Garden, New Orleans, Baltimore, Detroit, Philadelphia, and Newark.

- 2020-2021: Emergency grants to Federally Qualified Health Centers nationwide + second round of grants towards COVID-19 vaccination efforts (\$2.7M)
- 2020: Testing for America grant to help keep HBCU's open during the pandemic using Clinitest COVID Home Test Kits (\$500K+ \$2.275M in-kind)
- 2021: Six-million meals to combat food insecurity via Feeding America food banks (\$600K)
- 2021-2022: Community Development Financial Institutions investments in community clinics (Primary Care Development Corporation), affordable housing (Enterprise Community Loan Fund), veterans (PeopleFund), people with disabilities (Disability Opportunity Fund) sectors (\$4M)
