











S-Bahn Rhine-Neckar: New trains bring more options and comfort to the extended network as of December 13

(Stuttgart/Kaiserslautern/Mannheim, December 11, 2020) With the timetable change on December 13, 2020, passengers in Kraichgau, in southern Hesse, and between Mannheim, Schwetzingen and Karlsruhe can now enjoy the new Mireo (Series 463) trains running on the S-Bahn lines S5/S51, parts of S6 and the new S9 line: travel here will be even more comfortable, convenient and modern.

In a Europe-wide tendering procedure held by the responsible authorities – the Baden-Württemberg Ministry of Transport, the Zweckverband Schienenpersonennahverkehr Rheinland-Pfalz Süd (ZSPNV Süd) and the Verkehrsverbund Rhein-Neckar GmbH (VRN) for the Hessian district of Bergstraße – DB Regio Mitte was newly awarded operational responsibility for these new S-Bahn lines. The transport company will thus continue to provide transport services with a volume totaling around six million train-kilometers a year beginning on December 13, 2020.

57 new Mireo trains: Higher quality and comfort

The three-car, 70-meter-long trains have 200 seats and a maximum speed of 160 km/h. The interior design combines a generous sense of space with modern comfort and security features, including large passenger information displays, free WLAN access for passengers, and interior security cameras. Passengers benefit from comfortable seating, power outlets, a powerful air conditioning system and five multi-purpose areas with sufficient space for strollers, wheelchairs and up to 26 bicycles. The new Mireo Series 463 trains are built by Siemens Mobility.

Landesanstalt Schienenfahrzeuge Baden-Württemberg (SFBW) owns the trains and is leasing them to DB Regio for the duration of the transport contract.

All in all, the public transport authorities are investing around €270 million in the new train fleet, which has been designed to be particularly energy-saving and environmentally friendly.

On December 13, 2020, the new Mireo began operating on S-Bahn lines S5/S51 serving Heidelberg-Eppingen/Aglasterhausen and on the S9 route serving Groß-Rohrheim-Mannheim-Schwetzingen-Karlsruhe. There will still be mixed service with older trains on the Mannheim-Weinheim-Bensheim section on S-Bahn line S6. As of December 2021, the new trains will operate on the entire S6 Bensheim-Weinheim-Mannheim-Mainz route and replace the older trains. As planned, a total of 38 new trains began scheduled service on December 13, 2020, and the remaining 19 trains will follow in 2021.

Service improvements in the S-Bahn Rhine-Neckar network, Lot 2

As of December 13, 2020, the network's timetable offers the following improvements:

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- The new S-Bahn S9 line serving Groß Rohrheim—Biblis—Mannheim— Schwetzingen—Karlsruhe replaces previous regional rail services on this route. The line has also been extended beyond Biblis to Groß Rohrheim and service frequency has been improved.
- Service on the Groß Rohrheim–Biblis–Mannheim route is now provided on an hourly basis every day. In addition, existing gaps in the timetable on weekends and in the evening have been eliminated.
- Service on the entire Mannheim—Graben-Neudorf route is now provided on a half-hour basis every day. In the past, the half-hourly regional trains operated only on Monday to Friday and in some cases only to Waghäusel. As of 10:00 p.m., the trains on this route run every hour.
- Full-day hourly service on the Graben-Neudorf–Karlsruhe route has now been increased to half-hourly service during peak traffic times. Individual additional services are offered as fast connections with fewer stops during peak hours.
- Daily S5 service on the Heidelberg –Meckesheim–Sinsheim (Elsenz) route is now provided on a half-hourly basis (previously only Monday to Friday). Hourly service is provided on the other sections, and half-hourly service is scheduled part of the time on the Meckesheim–Aglasterhausen (S51) section.
- Daily S6 service on the Mannheim

 Bensheim section is now scheduled continuously on an hourly basis and achieved by running more trains in the evenings and by closing service gaps in the evenings and on weekends. Combined with the Main-Neckar-Ried Express trains running parallel on this route, half-hourly service is available.
- The new Weinheim-Sulzbach station has now opened and is also included in the S6 hourly service.
