




SUSTAINABILITY

Recovering water

Echoing the green-space challenge, São Paulo faces significant water shortages and pollution despite Brazil having the largest quantity of freshwater in the world. Unfortunately, the nation's water is unevenly distributed, and demand in São Paulo often exceeds supply, causing droughts that are steadily being exacerbated by climate change. Furthermore, São Paulo has lost around 35% of its water distribution. The **Siemens Water (SIWA)** digital services platform is a complete portfolio of software and automation solutions that make water systems safer and more efficient.




MOBILITY

Public transport improvements

Despite lower investment in public transport over recent years and economic difficulties caused by the pandemic, São Paulo has been steadily upgrading the lines to improve efficiency, regularity, and safety. For example, Siemens supplied **electrification solutions** for Line 9 of the CPTM system, including substations, transformers, medium and low-voltage panel columns, energy automation solutions, and protection systems. Siemens also supplied CPTM with **signaling** for Line 10 and Line 11.




OPPORTUNITY
