

## Our history in Malaysia

From the first independent commercial representative to a global technology powerhouse

---

### 1899

Siemens & Halske (S&H) assigns representation of its interests in the Straits Settlements to Schmidt, Küstermann & Cie in Penang and to Rautenberg, Schmidt & Cie in Singapore

### 1908

The newly opened Technical Office of Siemens Brothers Dynamo Works Ltd. in Singapore is responsible for the sales of its own products and those of Siemens-Schuckertwerke (SSW) in the Straits Settlements and the Federated Malay States

### 1924

The representation of S&H and SSW in the Straits Settlements is transferred to the Straits Java Trading Co., which operates offices in Singapore and Penang. Business transactions are handled through Arnold Otto Meyer, Hamburg

### 1963

Cycle & Carriage Co. Ltd. becomes S&H and SSW's agent for Malaysia and Singapore for two years

### 1967

Siemens supplies the Malaysian railways with automatic safety systems

### 1969

Malaysia is the first Asian country to purchase a 42 MeV Betatron

### 1969

A new agency agreement for Malaysia and Singapore is signed with the firm of Guthrie Waugh

### 1973

Guthrie Waugh Berhad represents the two countries separately and is renamed Guthrie Engineering (Malaysia) Sdn. Bhd. for Malaysia

### 1973

Siemens builds a semiconductor factory in Malakka (West Malaysia), creating some 1,500 jobs

### 1977

A license contract is signed for the manufacture of the masterset 111 portable telephone in Kuala Lumpur

### 1984

Siemens builds the Connaught gas turbine power plant west of Kuala Lumpur, including the fuel processing plant; the power plant is so designed that it can be expanded for operation as a combined-cycle plant

## **Our history in Malaysia**

### **1986**

Meditel Electronics Sdn. Bhd., in which Siemens AG has a 30 percent stake, becomes the representative of the Medical Engineering Group in Malaysia

### **1993**

Siemens Power Generation Asia Pacific (SPG) is founded in Kuala Lumpur to carry out power plant projects in the Region

### **1994**

The Paka combined cycle power plant, the first private power plant in Malaysia, is inaugurated

### **1996**

An order is received for the first networked hospital in Malaysia in Kuala Lumpur

### **2002**

The Express Rail Link from the main station in Kuala Lumpur to the new airport is opened

### **2005**

Siemens delivers the IT infrastructure, electrical equipment, and building and process automation systems for Infineon's semiconductor plant in Malaysia

### **2006**

Siemens delivers and installs the new baggage handling system for the International Airport in Kuala Lumpur

### **2012**

Kuala Lumpur's Mass Rapid Transit Corporation orders 58 Inspiro trains from Siemens and commissions the company to construct two depots

### **2013**

Siemens Malaysia delivers two units of the innovative H-class gas turbines to Tenaga Nasional Berhad, making Malaysia the first country outside of Germany to buy this gas turbine
